OLD BUSINESS:

FIREHOUSE: Deputy Chief John Thomen informed the board the Bator Door installers would be here Friday. They will bring new sensors to replace the old ones if that is the issue. The plumber arrived and was able to get the boiler running again. The hallway leak is still an issue but hopefully will be resolved soon. Tom Herman added Dennis Dong sent out a statement of requirements recently and waiting to hear back. ACGC started some warranties in July should not have begun until substantial completion is

filed. Fred Russell is currently working on the situation.





NEW ENGINE E5469: Deputy Chief Thomen reported the chassis was at the dealership. Deputy Chief Thomen is hoping the engine will be finished in April.

EXPLORER PROGRAM: Brian Bartholomew and Bill Carter were present for the update. Bill Carter stated there are currently three active cadets. Adult and cadets applications are available—\$ 45.00 per cadet and \$75.00 for the leader as the cost. Besides training, there are two meetings per month but less depending on what may be going on. Brian Bartholomew stated they train in safety gear, and once 18 years of age, they can go on a call. The cadets will have blue vests for identity on calls. The cadets will not be able to participate in a hazardous environment. If there is a fatality call, the cadets will not assist. Bill Carter stated instead of advertising, and they would like to reach out to the kids who have expressed interest as they want to keep it to 5 explorers. Brian Bartholomew stated this was a great program where the cadets will learn leadership and work together.

NEW BUSINESS:

FIREHOUSE CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION SERVICE

FIREFIGHTERS' ASSOC. REPORT: Aaraon Branscomb was not present.

CHIEF'S REPORT: Deputy Chief John Thomen reported he has received the end of the year report

from CALFIRE. This report is ONLY the calls that were dispatched through CALFIRE not including the local police department calls. CALFIRE reported 751 dispatch calls. 30 vegetation fires, 18 structure fires, 167 other, 221 traffic collisions, 191 medical calls, 75 HAZMAT, and 49 public assist. Little Lake Fire had the most traffic collision calls in Mendocino County. Little Lake Fire

was second highest in medical calls.
